Authors write for a variety of reasons:


- to persuade the reader to think or feel a certain way

As you read a text, think about the author's reason, or purpose, for writing it. Ask yourself the following questions to help you decide:

- Has the author provided factual information? If so, the purpose is to inform.
- Has the author given opinions and facts to get the reader to think a certain way or to encourage the reader to take action?
  If so, the purpose is to persuade.
- Has the author told a story that made you laugh or entertained you in some way?

If so, the purpose is to entertain.
